Half Term seems to have come around really quickly. We break up this Friday, 20 October at 3.15 pm and return to school on Monday 30 October. It has been a great start to the term with our new children settling in really well.

Harvest Festival Tuesday 31st October

For our harvest festival this year we will be supporting St Ives Food Bank. The food bank provides a minimum of three days emergency food and support. People are able to receive three days of nutritionally balanced food in exchange for their food voucher. The charity collects donations of food from the local community and from supermarkets to assemble the food boxes. Doctors, health visitors, social workers and other agencies identify people who need help and give them a food voucher. We are also able to access vouchers for families who need them, so please let me know if this is something that we can help you with.

We are inviting the children to bring food to school to donate to the food bank. They are happy to accept all kinds of food, but please don't send perishable items as the food may not be distributed immediately We will look at the work of the charity and at the issue of food and hunger in our harvest assembly.

BAGS2SCHOOL Thank you so much to all those parents who donated to our Bags2School fundraising event. The bags weighed 300 kg and raised the sum of £120 for school funds. There are more than 100 boats to be added and the rest of The Island. All the pieces have been fired by the Leach Pottery and are safely stored in Miss Dean's office. We are hoping for dry weather over half term to allow this to be completed.

STAFFING NEWS This term we welcome Heather Thomas to our teaching team. Heather is teaching Puffin class for two days per week. We have also been joined by Hattie Noall who has a placement with us for teacher training. Hattie was one of our pupils.

Teachers and their teaching assistants met together during the evening of Thursday 21 September. This is a yearly training session which really helps with class planning.

YEAR 2 The Year 2 children visited St Ives Lifeboat station recently. We are very grateful to Sarah Hall, and the lifeboat crew, for organising this. The children also looked at the harbour and the variety of boats contained within it. This linked to their study of the shapes of boats and sails.



Following on from the visit the children have carried out exciting science experiments on various materials to see which are the most buoyant.

The children have also been thinking about wind speeds and the tides and the moon as well as the water cycle.



The children have also studied paintings of the sea by local artists and discussed water safety.



YEAR 1 This term the children in Year 1 have been finding out about how to look after themselves and others. They have looked at how to eat healthily and have also thought about their senses.




The children have made their own wish boxes and produced pictures of themselves on the computer.

AUTUMN RECIPE

Blackberry & coconut squares

Ingredients

250g self-raising flour
25g oats
280g soft brown sugar
200g cold butter cut into pieces
75g desiccated coconut
2 medium eggs, beaten
350g frozen or fresh blackberries

Method

1. Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Tip the flour, oats and sugar into a large bowl. Rub the butter into the flour mixture using your fingertips until only small pea-size pieces remain. Stir through the coconut, then fill a teacup with the mixture and set this aside.

2. Stir the eggs into the bowl of mixture, then spread over the bottom of a lined baking tin (31x17cm), or a 21cm square tin. Smooth the surface with the back of a spoon, then scatter over the blackberries. Scatter over the reserved teacup mixture and bake for 1 hour – 1 hour 15 minutes until golden and cooked through (if you poke a skewer in, it should come out with moist crumbs but no wet mixture). Leave to cool, then remove from the tin and cut into squares. Serve with some extra berries, if you like. Great for teatime or to pop into a lunch box.

Dear Parent/Carer,
