Friends of the School

The Friends are also hoping to run craft stalls at a Christmas Fair at the Guildhall on Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th December to raise some additional money for the school. Our school choir will be singing at the fair on the Sunday at 1.00pm. We need more people to help on both days and would be really grateful for any time that you are able to give. Attendance

We have recently reviewed the children's attendance since September and letters are being sent to parents whose children currently have an attendance rate of less than 90%. The school's attendance for the last school year was 95.3% which seems to be quite high at first glance. However the national average is 96.1% and our attendance is in the lowest 10% nationally! So, as you can see, a small difference in percentage is significant. Our governors understand that some families can only take holidays during term time and we do therefore authorise a reasonable amount of holiday in these circumstances. We would therefore be very grateful if other absences could be kept to an absolute minimum (while also acknowledging that such young children will be susceptible to all the bugs and germs they encounter when they join school). Thank you for your help with this.

Christmas Dinner

Christmas Dinner will be held on Wednesday 13th December. If your child normally has a packed lunch, but you would like them to have Christmas Dinner, please complete the slip below and return it to school by Monday 11th December. School dinner is now free for all children, but we would like to know how many to cater for.

Christmas Party Monday 18th December

On Monday 18th December we will be holding our Christmas Parties. The children can wear party clothes or they can bring something to change into after lunchtime. The children will play party games in their classrooms and then join together for party food in the hall. We would be grateful if each child could bring a small amount of party food to share on the day.

School Library

We are very lucky to have parent volunteers to open our school library for the children at lunchtimes. The library can be accessed from the playground and the children can visit it after they have had their lunch to read and change their books. Each year group has a library day:

A record is kept of the books which each child reads and when they have read 10 books they are presented with a certificate in assembly. Please let us know if you can't find your child's library book at home as we don't want them to miss out and will allow them to borrow another one. We will be encouraging the children to visit the library so please look out for their library book in their book bags.

Ayr Field Big Tidy-Up 2nd and 3rd December 10.00am – 3.00pm

We have been contacted by the Ayr Field Community Group regarding an action weekend which they are holding to look after the field, which is at the top of Bullans Lane. A small group of volunteers is currently looking after the field and meet there on the first Saturday in each month, but more members are needed as there is plenty of work to be done! During the tidy-up weekend, volunteers will be cutting brambles, pruning trees and clearing overgrown areas. No expertise is required, all ages are welcome, and tools and gloves will be provided.
