In Phonics we will be:

Consolidating knowledge of phonemes: h, b, f, ff, ll, ll, ss, j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ai ,ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur

> Continuing with sound talking: k-i-ss, p-u-ff, sh-o-ck, n-igh-t

Continuing to blend the phonemes and say the word e.g. kiss, puff, shock, night

Reading simple sentences and captions: They went to the zoo at night.

> Introducing new words: her, all, are

Reading words and sentences containing diagraphs: cow, coin, dear, fair, sure, corner The cow was on the corner.

Key Vocabulary

Prediction = this is when the child guesses what might happen next in the story.

Recount = the child retells the story using the story language e.g: Once upon a time.

Sound talking = saying the sounds that build a word.

Digraphs = two letters that represent one sound.

In Mathematics we will be:

Consolidating: Estimating Adding two groups together '1 more than' with objects and numbers up to 10. Learning: Learning '1 more than' and '1 less than' a given number to 20. Subtracting single digit numbers. Number bonds to 6 = 3+3, 2+4, 1+5, 6+0 Learning to solve problems including doubling, halving and sharing.
