Music

Activities

- Compare school in the 1960s to school today
- Explore 1960s clothes and create 1960s clothes designs
- Make tie dye or flower head bands
- Dress up and take part in a 1960s parade
- Make ice lanterns
- Christmas baking
- Make Christmas decorations

Homework Project

The children will be invited to choose a 1960s theme to research and then present in class. (please see letter)

Other Activities to do at Home

- Point out full stops, capital letters, question marks and exclamation marks when reading
- When reading spot adjectives, nouns and verbs
- Play games involving money such as shops
- Start to practise telling the time
- Measure feet, height and other parts of the body
- Practise letter and number formation, with a focus on keeping it neat.
- Bake together

Literacy

In Literacy we will be:

- Creating information leaflet linked to the sixties
- Reading and writing poetry
- Focusing on using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.
- Trying to use conjunctions, such as and, but, so, when, because, in sentences
- Identifying and using adjectives, verbs and nouns
- Learning a Christmas story (Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present by John Burningham) and innovating it
- Writing our own Christmas stories



Mathematics

In maths we will be:

- Reading and writing numbers to 100 and for some children to 1000
- Adding and subtracting numbers
- Applying our addition and subtraction skills to calculate missing numbers in simple algebra and answer word problems
- Improving our counting forward and back in 2s, 5s and 10s
- Measuring and mass (weight)
- Multiplying and dividing numbers
- Finding fractions of shapes
- Telling the time: o' clock; 1/2 past; 1/4 past -perhaps your child might like to wear a watch to school or ask for one for Christmas!
