In Phonics we will be:

Consolidating knowledge of digraphs: qu, ch, sh, ng, ai, ee, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow

> Continuing with sound talking: qu-a-ck ch-ar-t sh-o-ck, f-l-oa-t

Continuing to blend the phonemes and say the word e.g. quack, chart, shock, float.

Reading simple sentences and captions: They went to the park and the shop.

> Introducing new words: her, all, are

Reading and writing words and sentences containing diagraphs: town, barn, book, cook, turn, rain, sheep, chick, shop. The cow was on the top of the hill.

Can you help?

In Guided Reading we will:

Recall the main points of a recount in the correct sequence.

Make predictions based on illustrations, story content and title.

Use phonic knowledge to attempt unknown words.

Spot tricky words which we are learning.

Sound talking and blending for reading.

Distinguishing between a word, a space and a letter.

Quick reading of high frequency words- and, it, is, in, up, at, on, an, as, if

Quick reading of tricky wordsto, we, he, she, me, be, was, my, you, they, the, I, no, go, so, a

Key Vocabulary Prediction = this is when the child guesses what might happen next in the story.

Recount = the child retells the story using the story language e.g: Once upon a time.

Sound talking = saying the sounds that build a word.

Blending = putting all the sounds together to the say the word as a whole.

Digraphs = two letters that represent one

In Mathematics we will be:

Consolidating: Estimating

Adding two groups together '1 more than' and '1 less than' with objects and numbers up to 10.

Learning:

Learning '1 more than' and '1 less than' a given number to 20.

Adding and subtracting single digit numbers.

Number bonds to 6 = 3+3, 2+4, 1+5, 6+0

Learning to solve problems including doubling, halving and sharing.

Activities to do at home:

After Easter we will start swimming at school. Please help prepare your child for our fun school swimming sessions by:

- Encouraging your child to enjoy water play at bath time.
- Drying themselves independently.
- Talking about water safety.
- Going swimming as a family.
- Practising undressing and dressing.
