In Phonics we will be:

Consolidating knowledge of phonemes: h, b, f, ff, ll, ll, ss, j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh

Continuing with sound talking: k-i-ss, p-u-ff, sh-o-ck

Continuing to blend the phonemes and say the word e.g. kiss, puff, shock

Reading simple sentences and captions: The man can go up the hill.

Reading words and sentences containing digraphs: quack, shock, sheep,

The ship is long and quick.

Consolidating the tricky words; he, she we, me, be,

Introducing new words: was, my, you, they, her, all, are

Can you help?

Do you have any old comics, envelopes or stamps that we could use?

Next half term we are going to follow the children's interest in growing! Please let us know if you have a keen interest in gardening, growing vegetables or have a pond!

In Guided Reading we will:

Recall the main points of a recount in the correct sequence.

Make predictions based on illustrations, story content and title.

Use phonic knowledge to attempt unknown words.

Spot tricky words which we are learning.

Sound talk and blend for reading.

Distinguish between a word, a space and a letter.

Quick read our high frequency words and tricky words. ie. and, it, is, in, up, at, to, we, he, she, me, be

Key Vocabulary

Prediction = this is when the child guesses what might happen next in the story.

Recount = the child retells the story using the story language e.g: Once upon a time.

Sound talking = saying the sounds that build a word.

Digraphs = two letters that represent one sound.

In Mathematics we will be:

Consolidating:

Estimating
Counting a chosen number from a large group of objects.

Learning:

'1 more than' with objects and numbers up to 20.

Finding the total number of items from two groups by counting all of them.

Introducing the stories of numbers to 6.

The story of 6 = 3+3, 2+4, 1+5, 6+0

Activities to do at home:

- have a go at sound talking
- hunt for tricky words
- recall the story in order
- spot capital letters and full stops
- begin naming letters
- talk about the title and author
- have fun!
