


YEAR 2 NEWS Parents have attended Learning Together sessions run by Mrs Sharma Benjamin which have been held in the Jubilee Room on Wednesdays. The sessions have focused on how we teach addition and subtraction using the new mastery approach. Open classroom has also been popular as it provides the opportunity for parents to look at their child's books and the classroom displays.



The Year 2 children have written their own version of the poem, 'The Sound Collector'. They have been reading information leaflets and using ICT to research ideas for their own leaflets on playground games.

RECEPTION Our Reception children have been learning to hold books correctly in guided reading and practising turning pages carefully. They have been telling stories from pictures and sequencing simple stories.



The children have been learning to recognise numbers from 0 - 20 and counting objects carefully from a group and in a line from 1 - 10.

NURSERY The staff have been busy decorating and it is feeling very festive in the nursery! The children have been building outside with our planks and blocks. They especially like making hot chocolate shops and car washes.

The children have also been looking at shapes, finding them hidden around the nursery and playing shape games on the touchscreen.
