Nut and Nut Products

A reminder that we are a 'nut aware' school, this means that we do not allow nuts or nut products into school under any circumstances. We have several children with serious allergies and any contact with nuts and products that contain them can have serious consequences.

We ask that parents/carers check items they send into school to ensure they follow our policy.

Premises
