Safety & Supervision on school site

We have had some reports of children being hurt whilst other, unsupervised children are using equipment around the school site after pick up.

The tunnel on our playground is one key area. The tunnel is safe if children are supervised so if we could ask that if you chose to let your child play on the site after collection, they are supervised at all times please.

Another key area is the Cornish hedging close to the bins in between our school and the junior school. Please ensure children do not climb on the hedging or the bins, as there is a substantial drop to one side which could cause significant harm.

New Covid Guidance – 1st April 2022

As you are aware the government guidance and measures around managing Covid 19 are changing today, 1st April 2022.

With Immediate effect

- There no longer be access to free Covid 19 tests except for NHS staff or specific groups
- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to

stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious.
- For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

They have reiterated their advice continued use of hygiene measures including regular hand washing/sanitising, covering the mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing

Thank you for all your kind words, in understanding, and support, of the very difficult staffing challenges we have experienced this week. It's not been an easy one and I am very aware of the impact closures have on children and parents. The decision is only taken once all other possible avenues have been explored and only when it would be unsafe to open.
