<u>PE Kit</u>

Please ensure your child has their PE kit on their PE days. Long hair also needs tying up please.

The type of activities taking place means it is unsafe for your child to take part in their school uniform.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please let your child's teacher know if there is a reason your child is not able to wear full school uniform. All children are expected to wear uniform for school; however, we appreciate things happen – ie that shoes may be ruined just before a holiday, and you intend to replace them then.

Our uniform comprises of the following;

- Black school shoes
- Yellow, White or Light Blue polo shirt
- Royal Blue jumper, sweater or cardigan
- Grey or black trousers/shorts
- Grey Pinafore/skirt
- PE white t-shirt
- PE shorts/leggings black or blue

<u>Attendance</u>

Please ensure that any absences are reported on the day of absence. Our office staff are finding they have to ring a lot of families where we have not received notification. We have a recent automated service which makes this much easier to do.

We are also experiencing a significant number of late arrivals. Please support us, and your child, to try and ensure prompt arrival. They can often become anxious about going into a class which has already started their leaning, as well as being aware that they have missed some or all of a lesson. We have also seen it can impact on friendships, self esteem and general anxiety.

If you need any support with any aspect of attendance, we are here to help in any way we can. We have successfully worked with families to support routines at home which has impacted on sleep, eating and getting out of the door on time. It really helps when your child knows we are working together.

Mrs Clarke, our pastoral lead is on site Monday, Tuesday afternoons and Friday all day. If you would like a call back or to arrange a chat with her please call the office.

<u>Covid</u>

Spring term has certainly been the term of covid for us! And whilst we are reflective, we had been lucky up to that point we have all been mindful of all our plans that have not been able to go ahead.

Thank you for your understanding and support. It is at this time that we, and all other schools, have to act on our own circumstances. At our worst point we had almost 50% of staff absent and 63 children affected. Apart from a few days in one class, we managed to keep school open, but with those figures its really easy to see how our usual school activities and events could not go ahead or were affected in some way.

We have had further cases this week but hopefully we are coming through the worst and will be able to get back to more normal activities; volunteers back in school, trips and events in person.

Final Note

I just wanted to reiterate my thanks to everyone for their support during this really challenging half term.

With the lighter nights, longer days and the suggestion of Spring (and less covid!) hopefully will come the opportunity to fully experience all that our Setting Sails curriculum offers.

Our focus on Go Cornish continues to improve and we now have all our greetings in assemblies in Cornish. I am still working on my pronunciation, however there are lots of helpful audio clips online to help with that – thank goodness! Our curriculum is incorporating more Cornish vocabulary which has been lovely to see and hear in our classes across school.
