
**HALF TERM** We break up on Friday 9 February at 3.15 pm for half term and return to school on Monday 19 February. We hope you all have a lovely break.

attendance rate of 94.8% which sounds quite high, but is actually well below the national average of 96.1% (in fact it is in the lowest 10% in the country!). We are aiming to increase this rate over the course of the year (to 95.5%) and we are therefore monitoring attendance very closely. All absences, whether authorised or not, are counted in the figures and that is why we would be very grateful if all absences could be kept to an absolute minimum.

We appreciate that young children do often get ill and there certainly have been some horrible bugs out there this term! As you know, the governors are sympathetic to families who are unable to take holidays during school holiday times, due to the nature of their employment, and we recognise this in our policy. If holidays are permitted during term time, in accordance with this policy, it is important that they are not for extended periods of time or repeated through the year as these will not be authorised.

Please remember that it is very helpful if you can contact us if your child is away from school so that we can code the absence correctly. If you are having any difficulty in bringing your child to school regularly please come and talk to us. We want children to come to school happily and if there are any problems then we will do everything we can to help.

**NURSERY** Several new nursery children have joined us this term and have settled in well.



The children have been bringing in pictures of their pets and their role play has been all about vets. They enjoyed a visit from a veterinary nurse and Basil and Monty, who are Miss Leonard Williams' dogs.

RECEPTION This half term the children in our Reception classes have been interested in space.

They have been building up and consolidating their skills with storytelling, guided reading, circle time and developing their fine motor skills.



YEAR 1 Our Year 1 children have been focusing on Travel and Transport this term. They have been studying a globe and maps and used them to discuss their own journeys. The children have also been learning about transport from the past. The children have been reading 'Mrs Armitage Queen of the Road'.

**YEAR 2** This term parents have been invited into Sandpiper and Cormorant class on Wednesday afternoons at 2.45 for Learning Together. There has been a 20 minute focus on maths skills followed by open classroom when parents are able to look at their child's books. It has been lovely to see the parents who have attended.

The children have been looking at different habitats around the world and the animals that live there. They have looked at how you can tell which type of food an animal eats, which animals lay eggs and how different animals adapt to their environment. They have considered the common characteristics of mammals and what they need to survive.



The children have been learning the story 'Augustus and his Smile' and writing their own versions of the story.
