Week Beginning 8.6.20 ~ Monday is World Ocean Day!

Have a look online at all the fantastic things planned on the World Ocean Day site

Over the next few weeks all the children returning to school will be involved in a crosscurricular 'Animals' topic. Below are some ideas to support learning at home in a fun, interactive and playful way.

Phonics
This week we will be revisiting the phonemes
x,y,z and Tricky Word 'a'
Perhaps you could look at Phonics Play online (login: march20, home)
Have a go at playing some Phase 3 games
Reading
We will be celebrating 'World Ocean Day' through our Animal topic with the book
'The Snail and the Whale'
Read the story together (great If you have a copy – if not look on YouTube for Miss
Saunders' version)
Discuss all the places the snail and the whale visited. Talk about the features they can see
and how we can look after our oceans and sea life.
Writing (mark making/ emergent writing)
Can you design a simple poster?
Talk for writing is very important – have a good chat about pollution, looking after sea life
and the things we can do to save our ocean.
Think of a simple, short and catchy poster caption you could write together.
Take your time to sound talk and blend for writing e.g. Pick up rubbish!
Maths
We will be revisiting counting on and back to find an answer on a number line.
Perhaps you could use a ruler if you have one at home, or write out your own number line
really big on some cardboard.
Keeping with an Ocean theme – you could use pebbles or shells to work out the answers in
a practical way to.
Work with numbers to 10 e.g. 2 + 3 = 5
(start at 2 – count on 3 more on your number line – what is the answer?)
Creative
Can you design your own poster with your caption on it?
Make it bright, colourful and eye catching.
Time to reflect!
Water play – bubble blowing, splashing, safety, add sea creatures and objects
Have a chat about - Looking after our environment.
Let's move!
Can you get the family up and moving?
This week add some swimming actions using your arms!
