Week Beginning 8.6.20 ~ Monday is World Ocean Day!

Over the next few weeks all the children returning to school will be involved in a cross-curricular 'Animals' topic. Below are some ideas to support learning at home in a fun, interactive and playful way.

<p>Phonics</p> <p>This week we will be revisiting the phonemes x,y,z and Tricky Word 'a'</p> <p>Perhaps you could look at Phonics Play online (login: march20, home)</p> <p>Have a go at playing some Phase 3 games</p>
<p>Reading</p> <p>We will be celebrating 'World Ocean Day' through our Animal topic with the book 'The Snail and the Whale'</p> <p>Read the story together (great if you have a copy – if not look on YouTube for Miss Saunders' version)</p> <p>Discuss all the places the snail and the whale visited. Talk about the features they can see and how we can look after our oceans and sea life.</p>
<p>Writing (mark making/ emergent writing)</p> <p>Can you design a simple poster?</p> <p>Talk for writing is very important – have a good chat about pollution, looking after sea life and the things we can do to save our ocean.</p> <p>Think of a simple, short and catchy poster caption you could write together.</p> <p>Take your time to sound talk and blend for writing e.g. Pick up rubbish!</p>
<p>Maths</p> <p>We will be revisiting counting on and back to find an answer on a number line.</p> <p>Perhaps you could use a ruler if you have one at home, or write out your own number line really big on some cardboard.</p> <p>Keeping with an Ocean theme – you could use pebbles or shells to work out the answers in a practical way to.</p> <p>Work with numbers to 10 e.g. $2 + 3 = 5$ (start at 2 – count on 3 more on your number line – what is the answer?)</p>
<p>Creative</p> <p>Can you design your own poster with your caption on it?</p> <p>Make it bright, colourful and eye catching.</p>
<p>Time to reflect!</p> <p>Water play – bubble blowing, splashing, safety, add sea creatures and objects</p> <p>Have a chat about - Looking after our environment.</p>
<p>Let's move!</p> <p>Can you get the family up and moving?</p> <p>This week add some swimming actions using your arms!</p>
