


SPECIAL EVENTS



If you would like to find out more about endangered animals you could create a model of an animal, a poster, a fact file or leaflet. This can then be used as part of show and tell during topic time.

Other Activities to do at Home

- Read widely and ask lots of questions about the text.
- Practise spellings every day if you can. Try and put them into sentences. Can you make different types of sentences?
- Remember that every sentence starts with a capital letter and ends with a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.
- Read topic books to find out more information about animals.
- Read scales—look at the different scales that are used at home.

Mathematics

In maths we will be consolidating:

- Develop rapid recall of X2 x5,x10 and 3x tables.
- Use these to solve one step multiplication and division problems.
- Consolidate, and extend, adding two 2-digit numbers using partitioning and counting on using number lines.
- Consolidate and extend subtracting two 2-digit numbers using partitioning and jumping back on a number line.
- Solve one-step and two-step money problems.
- Consolidate to read simple scales.

Literacy

In Literacy we will be:

- Learning the fact files about The Storm Unicorn and The Honey Bee.
- Writing our own fact file about endangered animals.
- Focusing on using correct punctuation.
- Trying to use conjunctions such as and, but, so, when, because, in sentences.
- Working on phonics and spellings on an ongoing weekly basis.
- Learning grammar—adjectives, past and present tenses, nouns, verbs, adverbs and recognising and using different types of sentence.
- Developing comprehension skills in reading.
