YEAR 1 NEWS The children from Year 1 have been enjoying their visits to Steeple Woods where they have taken part in all sorts of activities and explored the woods more deeply. Thank you to parents, grandparents and carers for volunteering to help with these visits.



The children have read and compared different versions of the Little Red Riding Hood story. They wrote an apology letter from the wolf as well as planning and writing their own woodland adventure story. Work in the classroom has been combined with weekly visits to the woods. RECEPTION NEWS Our Reception children will start their swimming lessons after Easter. This is always a great challenge for our staff with so many children to get changed but the children soon get used to the routine!





This half term the children have really enjoyed starting their 'design and make' project. They have looked at, and taken photos of, different types of construction and identified the different shapes that they could see. They were then able to design their own construction and try to carefully select the right pieces of junk modelling to make it!




The children have also enjoyed having nature walks outside, gathering natural objects and hunting for bugs! The children designed and made their own minibeads. On one of their walks they gathered materials to make their nature paintbrushes and the children loved using these when they made their own natural paints from spices, petals and berries! The

children also had a go at making their own playdough after smelling different herbs and plants and writing about these lovely smells. Puffin and Chough class have been learning about and exploring different days and festivals which they have celebrated together, for

PARENT INTERVIEWS Our teaching staff have been busy last month with parent interviews. This has been well supported and it is very helpful for parents to catch up with what has been happening at school and staff to compare notes with what has been happening at home.

NURSERY This term the nursery children have been retelling the story of the Three Little Pigs and have drawn pictures of the different characters. They have also read and retold the story of 'Handa's Surprise'. They tried some of the exotic fruits and made their own fruit kebabs.



YEAR 2 The Year 2 children have loved exploring Forces and Magical Magnets this term. They carried out investigations to explore friction while testing out cars moving down slopes. They tested different materials to find out which attract or repel a magnet. In English the children have loved listening to the story of 'Augustus and his Smile', and writing their own versions. The governors made a decision some time ago that it was becoming too dangerous to allow the parking to continue. The middle area of parking between the barriers at St Ives Infant School is available for blue badge holders to park in and staff only. This is being abused by other users driving in when the barrier is lifted for a blue badge holder.

EASTER BROWNIE BITES



Ingredients

175 g butter, chopped
150 g dark chocolate
250 g light brown sugar
85 g self-raising flour
50 g cocoa powder
3 large eggs, beaten
100 g milk chocolate chips
24 mini chocolate eggs, plus extra to decorate

METHOD

1. Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Line 24 holes of a mini muffin tray with paper cases. Put the butter, dark chocolate and sugar in a pan and heat it very gently,

stirring all the time until the butter and chocolate have melted. Remove from the heat and leave to cool for a few minutes.

2. Meanwhile, sift the flour, cocoa and a good pinch of salt into a large bowl. Stir in the warm, melted chocolate mixture and the beaten eggs, then add half the chocolate chips and mix until just combined.
3. Divide the mixture between the cases and place a mini egg into the middle of each muffin, pushing down gently. Bake for 12 – 15 mins until cooked but still gooey in the centre – they will continue cooking a little as they cool down. Leave to cool for 10 mins in the tin before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.
4. Melt the rest of the chocolate chips in short bursts in the microwave, or in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water, stirring frequently. Leave to cool until it is quite thick, then dot a small amount on each cake and stick on some more mini eggs.

AROUND THE WORLD WEEK



INDIA Choughs and Puffins really enjoyed learning all about India last week. They found India on the map and looked at some of their lovely clothes and patterns! The children had a go at using bright and metallic colours to make their own Indian patterns on some fabric. They also drew around their hands to design henna patterns and made patterns in the playdough. On Tuesday they listened to some Indian music. They talked about the sounds they heard and noticed which instruments they liked. This was followed by the children using instruments to have a go at making some of these sounds. The children loved using junk modelling to create some of their own Indian instruments! On Wednesday the children watched some clips of Indian dancing. They all learnt some dance moves and had

a go at these themselves to some Indian music. On Thursday the classes learnt about the smells and tastes of Indian food. They talked about their own experiences of this food and made an Indian rice pudding called Kheer. They ate this together and it was really yummy! On Friday they shared all of the lovely things they had learnt about India in the 'Around the World' assembly with the rest of the school.



CHINA William in Sandpiper class was born in China and so the class decided to find out more about it. They are writing a non chronological report on China focussing on:

- Where is it?
- What is the climate like?
- What type of people live there?

- What type of animals are found there?

The children have explored writing numbers in Mandarin using paints as well as role playing the story of the Chinese New Year.



KENYA The Nursery children have been learning how to say hello in Swahili – Jambo! They have looked at animals you would find in Kenya and have learnt a song about elephants. The animals were hidden in the garden so that the children could go on their own safari. They have been getting creative by making their own Maasai tribe necklaces. The Maasai have different meanings for each colour they use which we have found really interesting. In a group time we watched a video of the Maasai tribe jumping competition and had a go ourselves!

ITALY Heron class have been learning about Italy. The children have made their own passports and found Italy on the map. Their learning has taken them to Rome and Venice. They made gladiator shields and became Michelangelo by painting under the tables to recreate the Sistine Chapel! The children have made Venetian masks and gondolas which they tested to see if they would float. They have also

been learning how to count to 10 in Italian.



AMAZON – BRAZIL Kittiwake class have looked at Brazil on a map and seen how large the Amazon rainforest is. The children have been learning interesting facts about the rainforest including which animals live there and the size of the rainforest compared to our local woods. They have made rain sticks and rainforests in a jar.



MEXICO Cormorant Class have been learning about Mexico. They made their own sombrero hats, pinatas and marracas. The children learnt about and made their own Mexican flags and found out about the Circo de Mayo

which is a very important Mexican festival held in May with many parades and celebrations.
