Update on COVID Tests from NHS Test & Trace

How will households and childcare/support bubble members receive the home test?

We are encouraging households and childcare/support bubble members to get asymptomatic tests twice a week, which can be done through the following channels:

Individuals who are households/support bubbles of children and also cannot work from home, may have access to onsite workplace testing and should enquire with their employer.

Attend their local community testing site, which can be found via their council website or the gov.uk postcode checker: <u>https://www.gov.uk/find-covid-19-lateral-flow-test-site</u>

Some local and regional testing sites will offer a collect facility for home self-test. More information can be



found via their local council website, which can also be found through the postcode checker. A new online ordering service which launched on 1 March, will allow people to book a time to collect their test kits from some local and regional testing site

For people who cannot access these services there will be a supply of test kits available online for home delivery for those who need them the most.

Parking & Car Park

Please park responsibly when dropping off or collecting from school. We have had some concerns raised about the increased parking around the crossing area and the difficulties this poses for pedestrians and vehicles.

Please also remember that the carpark is also only accessible to blue badge holders or parents whose children have mobility needs.

Everyone can access free parking at the car park next to the leisure centre (please avoid using leisure centre staff car park) and the council has agreed to be flexible with timings to reflect our staggered starts and finishes.

Final note ...

It was an absolute joy to see the wider reopening of school on Monday and all our children return. I am well aware there may have been some sleepless nights the night before, and maybe a little anxiety after such a long absence. However the children all settled really quickly.

It was a real delight to be out on the playground Monday morning and see how excited many of our children were, but more than that, it was just such a great moment to see everyone back in school and happy. Once everyone was in, I checked in with each class and I have to say how proud of the children we all are. Within a few minutes, they slipped into familiar routines and it genuinely felt as if they had never been away.

I have commented to many people that our classrooms suddenly felt much smaller as the children seem to have grown so much. We definitely feel as if we need an extension to our carpet area in year 2! I hope you have also managed to adapt this week to some sort of normality. It's a huge adjustment for everyone, including you, having had the children at home for so long.

I do hope you managed to take some time for yourselves.
