School Improvements

Just before our first lockdown you may recall I asked parents and staff to volunteer time for a M.A.D (Make a Difference) day. This was with a view to work together as a community to improve areas around school. This is because school budgets are so tight there is little if any money for big projects.

Unfortunately, the impact of COVID put these plans on hold and also impacted on the availability of grants and our fundraising.

Things have been difficult BUT we now have the opportunity to start on those projects, albeit still hindered by COVID restrictions.

Our M.A.D day is 17th July in which we are asking if people can assist us with labour or donations to support our new Early Years outdoor project.

Project Rainbow (Early Years outdoors)

Now the library is well on its way the Early Years outdoor area is next on the development list. The team have planned the area and have put together a 'wish list'. If you think you could help with a donation from the 'wish list' we would be very grateful. The list can be found at the back of the newsletter.

We are also looking for some assistance before the day to jet wash the paving, build shelving in the sheds and a few other bits of prep.

On the day itself we need help to paint walls, sheds and equipment; create project boxes and many other things. We will work under covid restrictions in place at the time and if necessary, may need to scale back. However, despite any restrictions it would be lovely if we could make a start.

Project Butterfly update (Library)

Work is continuing in the library. We have disconnected the water and are taking out the sink unit and screen this coming week. The room will be painted awaiting the furniture which is arriving later this month.

We are putting in an order for new books and sorting out our stock in the old library.

We have also had a company in to quote for wall vinyl's and are awaiting a price.
