#### **Pupil Premium – School Meal Holiday Funding**

The funding for vouchers has been agreed again for the summer holiday by Cornwall Council. We have ordered the vouchers through WONDE again, so all our parents whose children qualify for pupil premium funding, will receive a voucher for £90 (£15 per week for the duration of the 6 week holiday). This will be accessed by one voucher which will be sent to you direct from WONDE.

## **Playground Improvements**

Raising the finances needed for this project has been extremely difficult however I am very happy to say that the fenced off area is due to be dug out and a new surface laid in the last week of the holidays. It costs £26,000 for a robust base and surfacing so we have only been able to go ahead with the surfacing at this time but hope to add Infant Trim trails to the bottom of the area at a later date, The top is to extend our wet weather play areas and ensure we are able to deliver PE lessons outside effectively.

## **Library**

Miss Lewis and I will be working on the library over the summer with some exciting and special plans for our reopening in the Autumn term. I look forward to sharing photos of our journey and the final area later in the year.
