#### **COVID Protective Measures**

The new variant and amended guidance from the government highlights the need to still be very aware and take the steps we need to support our whole community.

I would like to remind you that we are continuing to ask parents/carers to wear masks at drop off and collection times, and not to gather in groups on the school grounds.

We are not yet re-introducing staggered starts but continue to work as separate year groups as much as we possibly can yet limit mixing of groups. We continue to limit visitors to site and ventilate the classrooms as much as we can. Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing as opening the windows is our only option to support the ventilation advice.

Many of our community remain anxious about COVID and even more so now with the new strain. I ask that everyone is mindful of how others feel and follow the guidance we have in place at present.

If you are feeling anxious about covid in anyway then please do get in touch and I will happily go through all the protective measures in place in school.

As our clubs for the autumn term come to an end I would like to thank all of the staff involved in running these clubs.

#### Final Note

I met with one of our governors this week and reflected on the very unique last couple of years and how just a few months into my headship here at St Ives, we faced a global pandemic – definitely not something you expect, or plan for. I was looking back, as I am very conscious that this has seriously inhibited our parents coming into school and having those usual conversations and interactions. I have really missed this, as have staff and I know you have too.

As I am sure you aware that the deadline for new Reception applications is almost upon us and we would normally have prospective parents to look around school. The only way I can facilitate this at this current time is to offer parents an appointment on a Friday afternoon. This will be taking place on the 10<sup>th</sup> December, along with the option of a TEAMS meeting.

However, I am very aware that many of our existing parents have not yet had the opportunity to visit school, to meet staff properly and to get to know us or our school as much as you would in 'normal' circumstances'. I want you to know, it is still very much a priority for me, and I am working on how this can be safely facilitated in January.

We are now enjoying our last couple of weeks until the Christmas holidays with lots of fun, exciting activities taking place in school as well as in our local community.

As a school we have created 150+ Christmas tags for our local Cornwall Christmas Boxes which will be gifted to members of our local community via the Salvation Army. We have also been invited to decorate a tree for the Christmas Tree Festival and Christingle service at St Johns.
